

Share of Total Employed Q1:10





- Shift comes from increasing Multicultural share
- Hispanic share of total employed has increased from 14% to 16%.
- Asian share of total employed grew slightly, from 7% to 8%
- African-American held on to a solid 11% of the employed workforce



Share of Growth Q1: 2012-2013






Hispanic share of total market growth increased to 45%

Net Growth in Employment (000)




